



Call for Abstracts for the 16th Annual Duke Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) *Virtual* Fall Scientific Retreat

DATE: Tuesday, September 29, 2020; 9AM – 2:00PM

All pre- and post-doctoral trainees, as well as junior faculty investigators conducting AIDS-related research at Duke are encouraged to submit a **one-page abstract** for poster presentation at the sixteenth annual CFAR Fall Scientific Retreat.

This is an opportunity to share your research design, progress, and new insights with others in the Duke University community. Final results are not required, and ‘works in progress’ and posters that have been recently presented at other meetings are welcome.

The abstract page will be published in the Fall Retreat Program, so please use this format:

- Save and submit in PDF Format ([Submission link](#)).
- File name convention “LastName.FirstName.CFAR2020FR.pdf”
- *Name on file will be considered/contacted for poster/oral presentation*

Each investigator submitting an abstract will be expected to choose one of the following categories: Clinical, Basic/Translational, or Social and Behavioral Sciences.

- One abstract from each of these categories will be chosen for a 15-minute Oral Presentation during the CFAR Retreat.
- Five additional abstracts from each category will be selected for presentation and discussion during focused Zoom breakout sessions during the Retreat.
- Oral presenters are not required to present posters.
- All others must submit their poster as a pdf by **Monday, September 28, 2020**.
